Respected Muslims!

The Messenger of Allah (saw) said, **“Indeed the scholars are the heirs of the prophets. The prophets do not leave behind dinar or dirham. The only legacy they leave behind is knowledge.”**ⁱⁱⁱ So, let us protect the legacy of our beloved Prophet (saw). Let us be among those who demand knowledge and act according to what they know in order to earn the love of Allah (swt). We should also make efforts for raising our children, who are the assurance of our future, as individuals equipped with knowledge, wisdom, and good morality.

I would like to conclude the khutbah with the good news of our beloved Prophet (saw), who is the nicest teacher: **“Whoever takes a path upon which he seeks knowledge, Allah makes the path to Paradise easy for him.”**^{iv}
